



Reality Filmmaking & Risky Questions About God

Doug Addison with Darren Wilson [Episode 23]

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Hey everybody, Doug Addison here. Welcome to another Spirit Connection Podcast. You know, God is moving right now all over the world. He is drawing people to Himself. God is using the arts and entertainment. He is using music, movies ... you name it. He wants to use us all and God is creative. If you think about it, He created the Heavens and the Earth, He created you, and we are created in His image. Therefore that makes us creative, even if you are not an artist. Even if you are ... it does not matter. If you are an accountant, God created you in His image, therefore you have access to His unlimited creativity. And, that is what I want to talk about today.

I have a special guest on. He is a friend of mine—Darren Wilson from Wanderlust Productions. He is a filmmaker, television producer, he is actually an author of several books and he is absolutely powerfully advancing the Kingdom of God all over the world. Darren has released a number of films and television shows and has written books. Maybe you remember him from *Finger of God*, *Furious Love*, *Father of Lights* (the one I was on), *Holy Ghost* and also *Holy Ghost Reborn*.

Doug: Darren, welcome to the show.

Darren: Thanks, Doug. Thanks for having me, buddy.

Doug: Yes. Wow! Why don't you just tell everybody about yourself so we know who you are?

Darren: Yes. So, I mean, you kind of hit some of the high points. A lot of people do not know, but actually before I became a filmmaker—which is kind of, I guess, that is my main day job now—I was actually a college professor for 13 years up in Chicago. So for me, I kind of grew up in the church. For those people who don't know my story at all, I was always kind of like the good kid. I always believed in God. I don't think I ever knew a day in my life without, you know, knowing at least who Jesus was. By the time I think I turned 30 is when I started making these movies. And, at that point, I think I had just kind of ... my faith had grown really stale. It had grown ... it had weeds all around

it. I don't know. I believed, but I didn't ... My wife always described it like my faith was like wallpaper, where it colored my vision. It colored everything, but like I did not interact with it much anymore. You know, making these movies and now, gosh, TV shows, you know ... what it did is it awakened this kind of, I want to call it, a beast. It awakened something inside of me where I finally understood why God had created me but, more than anything, I became a friend of God and over the last 10 years that has been the coolest thing about this whole journey. So that is what I do now. I am a filmmaker. I make movies, I make TV shows, I have written three books but, you know, I just love to communicate the heart of God to people.

Doug: Wow! That is so powerful. I mean, here it is: a journey, right, from a professor. So, you obviously have some intellect, right, and you are serving the Lord and then suddenly God interrupts you. Do you remember when that happened?

Darren: Oh, yes. Yes. It was in Toronto, actually, up at the crazy Airport Church. I remember when my wife dragged me up there; I did not want to go. It is funny because it is like, you and I, we are friends of a lot of the same people—Heidi Baker and all these guys. It is funny. All of our stories are very similar. Like the first time ... and a lot of it comes out of this Toronto thing. I remember the first time I was there; I hated it. I mean, oh my gosh, I never wanted to go back. So, my wife dragged me there for ... it was like a prophetic conference. I remember just thinking, "Everybody here is crazy;" like "This is not of God;" like "This place is nuts." And then the Lord, you know ... long story short, He hit me upside the head. I had a wild angelic encounter. Another mutual friend of ours, Bob Jones, was one of the speakers and I thought Bob was a nut. I thought he was absolutely ... I remember it was during worship and he got up on stage and he interrupted worship and he says, "I just want you all to know that an angel has just entered the building and his name is Breakthrough." He goes on and he tells all the background about Breakthrough, and everybody is going crazy. I am in the back and I am just like, "This is the dumbest thing I have ever heard in my life." So they just keep worshiping. So I just decided to, you know, be the one good, you know, "True Christian" here and not be crazy, and I am just going to worship God like in a normal calm way. About five minutes later, I had this ... there is no other way to describe it other than a massive encounter with this angel named Breakthrough. He came up to me. I could see him with my eyes closed very, very clearly, and he spoke to me. Three times he asked me, "Are you ready?" and three times I said, "Yes." I did not even know what I was saying "Yes" to. After the third time, he just looked at me and he said, "Make that movie." I knew that about four months before that I had gotten this idea that I knew was from the Lord for this crazy little documentary about miracles, but I did not want to do it because it was super Christian. It was a documentary, and like I am a professor. I am a writer. I don't make movies. So, I was kind of running from it, but then I had this kind

of encounter and the Lord put me in my tracks. So, yes, I had this encounter with the angel named Breakthrough.

Doug: Wow!

Darren: After that, I started making this movie and just borrowed money from friends and family, and borrowed equipment from the school where I was teaching and, yes, I made *The Finger of God*. And the rest is history, man.

Doug: Wow! Wow! Yes, I remember that. I mean, I remember you going through that process, but I did not know that it was through, you know, a prophetic word with Bob Jones and the angel Breakthrough. How powerful is that? Wow!

Darren: Yes, and it is interesting, too, because now you look at the film and they definitely have this kind of ... I don't know any other way to put it, but they have kind of a spirit of breakthrough on them, where they kind of break through people's perceptions. They break through their, you know, the things that they have against Christians or Christianity or God, whatever, and it just kind of breaks down people's walls. It is interesting that that was kind of the commission that started it all.

Doug: Yes, that is very powerful. A lot of people don't realize that you can have those encounters and, you know, you have your eyes closed. It doesn't have to be a straight-up angel standing in front of you like that.

Darren: Yes. I mean, that is definitely the only time that has ever happened to me. I have had a lot of encounters with the Lord, but it has been much more tender and sweet and kind of chill. That was definitely the one big one, and I think partly because I was such a skeptic in the beginning that I think the Lord knew. Like, He really needed to hit me upside the head. You know, He needed to give me a good whack to get me off my rear end to do this thing, because there was no way I was going to do it.

Doug: Right. You know, that is something people do not realize about the supernatural side of God. You know, you don't have to have these big encounters if you are already doing what He wants you to do, you know? Sometimes it has to be like the Apostle Paul, you know, on the road to Damascus, you know? Get knocked on your butt a little bit.

Darren: Yes. Everybody wants the big encounter, but I am like, "Actually, if you get the big encounter, you are probably being an idiot. That is why you are probably having these big encounters." It is better to just have intimacy with the Lord and go that route.

Doug: Right. That's what I say, anyway. So, what year was that when you did *Finger of God*?

Darren: That was 2006, I believe. Yes.

Doug: I remember it. I remember you calling me. I was living in North Carolina at the time in Moravian Falls.

Darren: Yes.

Doug: You called me, because you said something about the Lord said that there was going to be a move of God happen in Chile and the Lord told you to call me and you were filming *Furious Love* and you wanted to capture what happened in Chile on *Furious Love*.

Darren: That's funny. I totally forgot about that. That is so funny.

Doug: I wanted so bad to do it. I mean, sure enough, I was going to Chile. It turned out the group down there said "No." They did not want to bring in the cameras, but I am telling you, you were right. The Lord was right. When I got down there—I think it was right around 2008 or something like that—when I got down there, it was the most powerful time I have ever had to date. I mean, the Lord moved like I have never seen before and it never got captured. Sadly, it should have been on *Furious Love*, you know. The Lord wanted it on *Furious Love*, but there was just some disconnects or whatever. But it was absolutely right and it was a powerful encounter there.

Darren: Well, it only took us a movie later and we were finally able to hook up. So that was good.

Doug: Yes. So, the Lord did tell me that you were going to ask me and I think you came to one of my workshops. I was with Patricia King. I was doing, *How To Do Comedy In Ministry* or something like that. It was kind of a silly, you know, showing people how to do standup in messages and you were there. You were in the crowd.

Darren: Yes, because I knew I was going to ask you again, it sounds like. I did not care about comedy and standup. I was just like, "I am going to get this guy in my next movie."

Doug: I thought, "Wow!" I am looking out, "Hey, there's Darren Wilson. He must really love me." I actually knew because I am prophetic. You know, I knew what was going on. Plus, you were a speaker, right? Weren't you one of the speakers?

Darren: I was. Yes. I was speaking with you.

Doug: Yes. It was a powerful weekend there, and in Arizona as well when we did that.

Darren: It was the best one.

Doug: So, then you did *Furious Love* and then *Father of Lights* and I was part of that one and many other people. It was a powerful time. You came out to LA. As you are looking at it, did the Lord really give you anything, or did you learn something specific, or did He give you anything for each of these movies?

Darren: Yes. I mean, each one ... I mean, honestly, people think that I have a ... that I go on these movies and it is all kind of planned out and I know what I want to do. Honestly, I just have lots of questions, so for each movie that I do, there is always kind of a specific theme or a topic that I am kind of going after and, honestly, it is the topic that I am dealing with at that time. So, you know, with *The Finger of God* it was, "Is God still in the business of miracles?" because I was hearing all these crazy stories. My aunt and uncle had gotten gold teeth. I am like, "Is this stuff actually happening?" I just wanted to kind of just go and investigate it. Then with *Furious Love*, it is like I had been hearing all this stuff about spiritual warfare and the demonic and all this kind of stuff and I just wanted to find out, like, "What is love? What does love look like and what does it look like in the midst of darkness?" So, with *Father of Lights*, though, I always knew that was going to be probably one of the most important films I would ever make, because it was about the Father. It was about the Father's heart. You know, when I was at my absolute kind of, I guess, lowest point spiritually before I had made any of these movies, when I was barely holding on, there was one guy. I hated going to conferences. I hated going to ... honestly, I hated going to church, but there was one guy. He came to my home church, I remember. I think my wife dragged me, but I actually really liked this guy. You may have known him, Jack Frost.

Doug: Yes.

Darren: His whole stuff on embracing the Father's heart ... I mean that was, honestly, before Bob, before Toronto—that was the thing that started to kind of melt the iciness around my heart. So, I always had this kind of soft spot for the Father, but I also was very aware that I definitely did not have the proper perspective of the Father because I was hearing people talking about Him and it was revelatory to me. So, for me, *Father of Lights* was one of the most important things because it is really what broke down my defenses towards the Father. I always viewed the Father as just kind of stern, kind of ... not mean, but like He definitely was not the cuddly one. You know, like Jesus was like your homeboy. Jesus was like your brother. He was the one who was like nice and sweet and you could hang out with. The Father was kind of like distant and whatever but, you know, making that movie was really ... that is really what opened my eyes and, you know, over the years has opened millions of other people's eyes to the true heart of the Father which is, you know, just like Jesus said, "If you have seen Me, you have seen the Father." Like, if you love Jesus, you are going to really love His old man. So, for me, that was a really, really important film. And then when you move on to the *Holy Ghost* and *Holy Ghost Reborn*—those were two where I knew I really

wanted to understand more about the Holy Spirit because the Spirit was always ... He was always kind of mysterious to me and, again, I make these for myself. I make these if I have questions. So, you know, heading into next year, I will probably ... I am going to start making my next film, which is called *The God Man* and that is going to be all about Jesus. Again, I feel like I know a lot about Jesus, but I really want to dig deep into like who He truly is and just really make, you know, the Jesus film for my generation—the Jesus film that I really want to see. You know, all of these films ... they definitely teach me something along the way and that is why I value them so much and I love that I get to do this for a living. You know, I get to tell God's stories. You know, honestly, I do this for me. I do it because I really want to know who God is, if that makes any sense.

Doug: Yes, it makes sense. Do you know what? I am realizing as you are saying this that it is almost like you are a living parable. You know, all the stuff that is going on in your life suddenly becomes all these films.

Darren: Yes, that is probably ... that is a pretty decent way to put it. I mean, you can definitely find out kind of where I am at based on the film that comes out in that particular season of my life.

Doug: Exactly. I always say it about pastors, too, because I was one for a while. You can tell what they are going through by their sermon series.

Darren: Uh huh.

Doug: So it is powerful once you realize that, though. You know, I know just looking at *Father of Lights*—you know, because that is the one I knew very intimately because of being part of it—but the whole point that we are living in a time right now with a fatherless generation and people talk more about Jesus and, like you were saying, it is almost like Jesus is God's healthy and well-adjusted Son, right?

Darren: Uh huh.

Doug: We can relate with Him, but I am not sure about this Holy Ghost guy here with His really high power. I am not sure about the Father up there. You know, He freaks me out. I am just going to deal with Jesus as Lord. So, I like the fact that you take that on. I don't know if you have ever noticed that.

Darren: Yes. I mean, I hear it all the time. A lot of people, you know, everybody always wants to give you their opinion. Like, "This is my favorite." "This is my ..." I mean, *Father of Lights* is probably the one I get the most. That is everybody's—not everybody's—but that is a lot of people's favorite of the films and I think it is because of the revelation that it brings to a lot of different people. What we tend to do, obviously, is when you are talking about the Father, you kind of replace, you know, a lot of times, your own experiences with your own earthly father. Kind of like you put that template on top of it. So

however your earthly dad was, that is kind of like ... You know, unfortunately, it gets kind of ... the heavenly Father gets kind of washed with the same brush. You know, when you are talking about the fatherless generation, I mean, most of them do not even know their dad, so He becomes this kind of real ethereal, mysterious kind of “out there” person. When I encountered the Father’s heart, that was when I was ... that just devastated me. That is when I was like, “I am all in. I am all Yours, because anybody who could love that much, you know, I have no reason to be afraid of You anymore.”

Doug: Yes. Wow! That is really good, Darren. So now, tell us a little bit more about *God Man*. This is the new movie that you are going to be working on soon?

Darren: Yes. So, I will probably start raising money for it and I want to shoot it in 2018. But honestly, I don’t know much about it. The Lord has given me very little. I will kind of go off in September to kind of dream it all up with Him. I just know this has been on my heart for a couple of years and it is probably going to be the last of these, I guess, what I call the “Godumentaries”—the kind of God adventure movies—because there are just lots of other topics and different types of movies that I want to make. This is going to be the one that is like ... I just want it to really go out with a bang. All I know is I just want to reveal who Jesus is to this generation. I want it to be super exciting and I want it to be really powerful and I want it to be a really big deal. So, I am believing that the Lord is going to tell me how to do it. He has never let me down, so I know He will give me some pretty good ideas of things and you can rest assured we will definitely be pushing some boundaries and making some people uncomfortable. But it is not a movie unless you do that.

Doug: That’s great. Right, and I like the fact that you are going to be seeking Him in September because, of course, those are the Days of Awe, Rosh Hashanah.

Darren: Ah hah. That is awesome. I didn’t think about that.

Doug: Yes, and a lot of revelation is going to be flowing right around then. While we were praying ahead of this—we were praying just with the two of us—I gave you a word that between now and September something is going to open for you, so we will see how that plays out.

Darren: Yes. For sure.

Doug: You also are working on some television stuff. Why don’t you tell us about it?

Darren: Yes. So, I am really ... this has been a lot of fun. It has definitely been a different season for me. I have always wanted to do a TV show and I just could never figure out the right concept for what I do. But this season just kind of opened up and we had this opportunity with TBN and God TV and basically all the channels just to make this show. So, the first show is out right now and you can watch it on these networks or you can get it from our website. It is called *Adventures with God* and it really looks back over the last

10 years—just everything that I have filmed, because everything that I do I am just having these kind of mini-adventures that we just slide them together into really cool movies. This is fun for me to be able to kind of really take these separate adventures and kind of draw them out and put in a lot of the extra stuff that did not make it into the movie, but also really look at different, just big questions that I have about God and about faith. So, I am just going to, you know, slam all these things together in this really fun, fast-paced half hour TV show. So, *Adventures with God* is kind of my first kind of foray into TV. Now we have a new ... another series coming out called *Questions with God*, which is really just me with a lot of my friends just wrestling with these big questions that I have. What I have found is ... I do not have like ... I never really have peace, if that makes any sense. Like, I have peace, but like I have so many questions about God and about faith and I do not do like pat answers well. Maybe it is the professor in me, I don't know, but I really want to dig down and I really want to get to understand God as much as I possibly can, knowing that I cannot really fully understand Him, but I don't like just, "God has His way." Well, okay. Talk to me about His ways. I want to know what His ways are, you know. So, for me, I would just love to kind of just dig into some of these bigger questions that I have that I am finding that other people have too. So, *Questions* is really just more of that kind of round table discussion with whether it is pastors, evangelists, celebrities, rock stars ... I mean, we just kind of ... I just get a bunch of my friends together in a room and we just have these fun, deep discussions. So, I am finishing that up right now and then I am right in the middle of Season 2 of *Adventures* and then that will be followed by Season 2 of *Questions*. So, I have two seasons of each and then finally after that I will have TV out of my system so I can get back to making movies, which is really what I was created to do.

Doug: Yes. That is what the angel Breakthrough said to you, right, was filmmaking—even though the rest of it is all good?

Darren: Yes. It is just different seasons. It is different ... you know, I definitely ... it is something that is important and I think a lot of people will get a lot out of these things. But at the end of the day, I mean, I have been put on this Earth to make movies that, you know, impact the generations. So, I want to get back to that, and I am getting excited to get back to my real day job.

Doug: That sounds good, man. Well, here. Why don't we just talk about the whole creative process for a minute here, because here you were a professor and you made this big change. You borrowed equipment from your church, right, to do your first film?

Darren: Um huh.

Doug: You know, looking back on that film, you know, I even heard you say that it was not exactly the quality you would do as a filmmaker.

Darren: Well, yes. I mean, to be fair, I did not know what I was doing. I mean, I had never made a movie before. I had never edited before, so I had to teach myself all this stuff kind of as I was doing it, whereas a lot of other people ... they get to, you know, they get to have some failures first or whatever. For me, I was just figuring it out as I went along. So, all I really brought to the table was an understanding of storytelling, because I was a writer and I had trained for, you know, many years on how to tell good stories, but always as a writer. So, you know, it is funny. I look back and I have had to stop myself lately because you want to look back. You look back ten years ago and you go, "Oh, my gosh, I am so embarrassed. Like, I cannot believe what that movie looks like right now." But at the same time, I realize, do you know what, that is also I think what helped to make that movie what it was because (1) nobody had ever seen anything like this before, but (2) I think people really responded to the idea that this is not some slick presentation. Like, this guy is definitely not trying to pull the wool over our eyes, because he does not know what he is doing. Do you know what I mean? Like, it was so raw that I think people really responded to it because it was real. So, you know, I have to ... I have forced myself over the last couple of years to stop like bashing *Finger of God* because, you know, the artistic part of me is like embarrassed. But at the same time, it really is ... it needed to be that way for just the plan of God for all of it. So, again, I am just so grateful and so thankful that God, you know, picked out this kid to tell His story.

Doug: Wow! You know, it is so right. Don't despise humble beginnings.

Darren: Exactly.

Doug: I will attest. Absolutely. I was not bashing at all. I just want people to know this. You know, we sometimes can get hung up with perfectionism and things like that. I know I am guilty of that, but there is such a strong anointing that brought that with the hand of God—*The Finger of God*—that was on the movie. It did not matter if you were borrowing, you know, your camera from your church or you are learning to do this on your Mac while you were doing it. It did not matter, because when you obey the Lord He will open the doors.

Darren: Absolutely, and this is what I tell people all the time. You know, if God is truly calling you to do something, it is literally impossible for you to fail at it. He is not in the failure business. He does not do failure. Do you know what I mean? I found that when I have failed, the biggest failures that I have had professionally have always come when I am stepping out and trying to do my own thing or I am trying to like, you know ... I am not really paying attention to what the Lord is asking of me. I am just, "Well, this is a good idea," and so I will go and do it. But whenever He has called me to do something, He has asked me to do something, (1) it is really easy to accomplish, but (2) it always brings with it, you know, some sense of achievement. Now, it may not be like you are going to sell a million copies, but there is definitely like ... there is fruit that will always come from the thing that He has called you to do.

So, I always tell people, “Just stop stressing out, man. Just be obedient. The best, you know, creative advice, professional advice I can give you is just be obedient to the Spirit, because when you are obedient to Him, He knows what He is doing and He will take care of you.

Doug: Yes. Another thing I would like to just point out is you do not need a visitation from a breakthrough angel.

Darren: No, you don’t, but you do have to have an intimacy with God. You do need to be able to hear His voice in some way, shape or form. But you know, when I made *Finger of God*, I mean I literally could not hear the voice of God at all. So, for me, it was the angelic encounter and that was it, and the rest of it was just people who I filmed. I was like, “Did God tell you anything? Did God tell you anything for me?” It was like I did not trust my own ability to hear Him. Again, making these films, the Lord slowly kind of drew this thing out of me and I started to realize what true intimacy with Him looks like and I learned how to hear His voice. I am a strong advocate of really kind of zeroing in and learning to hear what the voice of God sounds like to you, whether it is through the Word, whether it is through dreams, whether it is through ... however He wants to communicate, because otherwise you are on an island and you are just guessing.

Doug: Right.

Darren: I am not really a ... I would much rather, you know, skip the line and go straight to whatever He wants me to do.

Doug: Well, on that topic of hearing God, how does God tend to speak to you?

Darren: Yes. A couple of things. He speaks really strongly to me through dreams. That is one thing. And I have noticed, you know, if you want Him to speak to you through dreams, you have to start paying attention to your dreams. Most people—they do not remember their dreams, because they are not paying attention to them. That is one thing. But honestly, He speaks to me a lot through when I am reading the Word. He will talk to me. A lot of times for me, it is in church during worship when I am just kind of starting to get lost just in His Spirit and that is when, you know, I will get pictures or ideas. Half the time you will see me in church, I am scribbling something down because the Lord just spoke to me again. But really, it is kind of like any time I just sit down and I am just trying to listen to Him. It is usually like little phrases or pictures that He will give me. If I am praying for somebody else it is always pictures, but when it is just me and Him, kind of one-on-one, a lot of times it is just little phrases or impressions that I get and then He will usually ... He will use other people a lot of times to kind of confirm those things. So, it is the whole gamut really, but I have definitely learned to know like, you know, pay attention to the little whispers, because that is usually where He is found.

Doug: Yes. Exactly. I love that. We all hear God based on our gifts and our personality. I always say God will speak to you any way you will hear. You know, if you are listening to secular music, He is going to do that. He just wants to get His message to you because of intimacy and His great love. So, it sounds like a pretty wild ride you have been on. Was there ever a point where you wondered, you know, if this was crazy, maybe you should stop? Did you ever have any really difficult times?

Darren: Not really. I mean, not as far as this stuff goes. I mean, I have always ... it has been so much fun. I mean, honestly, there has been some really ... People think that it is like all unicorns and rainbows making these movies but, honestly, it is a ton of work. There is always ... at the end of kind of the filming process, I am like so close to burnout because it just stretches me. I mean, people a lot of times—they think that they get stretched watching an hour-and-a-half of my film. But you have to understand, for me it is a year to a year-and-a-half of getting stretched to the extreme. So, there is a reason I have not filmed anything for three years since I finished filming the two *Holy Ghost* movies. It is like that thing almost killed me. So, for me it is really about just kind of recharging and getting back to like, you know, kind of my first love, so to speak. But I have never really like questioned if I am nuts or anything like that because, I mean, the fruit is so apparent. That has gone by the wayside for sure.

Doug: Yes. So, what are some of the fruit? What are you hearing as far as the responses back?

Darren: Oh gosh. I mean, thousands upon thousands of people, you know ... people getting saved watching the films. People getting healed watching the movie. I mean, it runs the whole gamut. But mostly it is so fun for me to have people come up to me and they will say, "I know you've heard this a thousand times, but like I just ... like, thank you. Thank you for making these movies, because they have literally changed my life." I have heard that more than I can possibly count. And it never gets old, because it just reminds you like, okay, this is why I do this. When I make these things, in a lot of ways I am making them in a vacuum. Like, I am in my basement putting these movies together in my little studio. Just the fact that they have traveled all over the world and that they have done so much for so many people ... I mean, it is super, super humbling to me. Still, I just go back. I cannot believe God chose me. I cannot believe He chose me, because I had such a bad attitude at the beginning, you know? He is incredible. He is the most grace-filled person that I have ever encountered.

Doug: Me too. Do you know what? It makes it believable. You know, it is not like you were handed this grant and this whole thing. You were just handed this vision and the Word of the Lord and you were obedient and you went out. Wow! Look. Ten years later and the Kingdom of God is full of fruit. Full, full, full. More than 10 years. It is just so full now because of all you did, you

know? So, I just want to have you pray and release whatever you feel God is giving you right now for our followers.

Darren: I would love to. Well, Heavenly Father, I just pray for everybody who is listening to this and, God, I just ... First of all, I just release just a fresh wave of Your creative Spirit. I just sense there are a lot of people listening to this and you are so hungry to do something for the Kingdom. You are so hungry, but you do not know what to do or you feel frustrated or you feel held down. So, I first of all just release breakthrough to you and I release just a fresh creativity. But I also release a boldness to just do whatever God is asking you to do. Father, I ask that You will begin to speak to those who are listening to this—that You will begin to speak to them in new ways; that You will speak to them in their dreams.
